Stonycreek-Conemaugh River Improvement Project

A new book "Keystone Fly Fishing" has just been published by Headwater Books. The book covers fly fishing opportunities for the entire state of Pennsylvania. Although books of this type have been written before by a single author, this publication differs dramatically since it is a compilation of nine regional authors who live and fish in areas they cover.

Len Lichvar, Somerset Conservation District Manager and SCRIP Chairman wrote the southwestern regional component of the book. Len, in addition to being a professional conservationist, has been a professional outdoor writer for over 30 years and was selected as a co-author for his fly fishing expertise and writing skills.

Although the book is oriented to fly fishing, it is still a valuable reference book for fishing waters across the state, for trout and warmwater species for anglers of any type.

In the southwestern section of the book Len also covers time revived waters such as Quemahoning Creek, Wells Creek and the West Branch of the Susquehanna River for the first time on a national level. These waters have only in recent years become viable fisheries because of efforts of SCRIP and other partners. Waterways such as the Stonycreek River, Casselman River and many of their tributaries, that have been written about previously, are now covered in more depth and detail and with the latest information on their ever increasing recreational potential.



Trout in the Classroom Projects Continuing This Year

The Kiski-Conemaugh Stream Team is leading several Trout in the Classroom projects again this year. In the Upper Conemaugh River Basin, the Stream Team is working with the Mountain Laurel chapter of Trout Unlimited to raise funds for the TIC program and to offer technical assistance and environmental education programming. As has become our custom, after students release their fish into a state-approved body of water, they will participate in 3-6 Outdoor Discovery Workshops led by the Stream Team, MLTU and its partners. Volunteers are needed to help teach students how to cast a fly line and sometime fish, usually with spinning rods provided by the PA Fish and Boat Commission.

Also, on May 23, Shanksville-Stonycreek Elementary School students will participate in an Outdoor Day at the Central City Sportsmen's Club. After a few morning sessions, students will fish at the pond and many hands are needed to help the third graders.

SCRIP \$500 Scholarship

The Stonycreek Conemaugh River Improvement Project will be awarding a \$500 Scholarship to a worthy student for the current academic year. Deadline to submit is March 30, 2017.

Eligibility—Applicant must:

Either be a dues-paying SCRIP member or the child of a SCRIP member

Reside in one of the counties that includes the Kiski-Conemaugh Basin (Armstrong, Cambria, Indiana, Somerset, or Westmoreland). Residency means the student lives in or is a resident at a school in one of these counties.

Be in an accredited environmental field of study at a Pennsylvania college or university.

How to Apply:

The application should contain these three parts:

- Part I- A cover sheet with the following information: name, mailing address, email address, phone number, college or university attending, year and course of study
- **Part II-** A typed statement, double-spaced, 12 pt font size, no longer than two pages explaining applicant's professional goals, how the course of study will meet those goals and any involvement to date in the field.


Part III- A copy of applicant's latest transcript

Applications must be received by March 30, 2017. Please send to: SCRIP, Scholarship 2017, P.O. Box 164, Windber, PA 15963. Award notification will be no later than April 30, 2017. Award check will be sent directly to the Financial Aid Office at the college or university.

Award recipient will be required to inform SCRIP of his or her personal academic achievements, graduation and future career plans in article form for publication in the SCRIP newsletter. This information will be used to assist with promotion of any future SCRIP scholarship awards.
